Lesson Six—The Proof Of The Bible Being The Word Of God

Background:

Most teachers and professors that the young people will have to encounter during their high school and college years do not believe that the Bible is the inspired Word of God. Many will oppose this thought, challenge its authenticity, and ridicule the believers. This lesson is designed to equip the young people with twelve points that prove that the Bible is the inspired Word of God, from cover to cover.

Burden to Impart:

This lesson is interesting and inspiring as we open up these points as proof of the Bible being the Word of God. The burden to impart is for them to develop a true love for the Bible and a confidence in its authenticity. We are burdened that the young people will use the Word of God as they preach the gospel to their friends and so this lesson is critical in preparing them for this function in their young Christian life.

Focus:

The burden in this lesson is to equip the young people to face any opposition and attack concerning the authenticity of the Bible. We need to infuse them with these twelve proofs to help the young people be strengthened in their faith and confidence that the Bible is truly the Word of God. These proofs should be a real shepherding of the souls of the young people to affirm and confirm that the bible has withstood every test and is truly the Word of God.

Points for serving ones to consider

The below points are suggestions that may be useful for the servings ones to prepare for the group time. These points are suggestions to help bring out fellowship concerning the burden of the message. Do not feel you that you need to go through all of them.

1. Many of us have had experiences where we were reading the Bible or ministry and we had to stop, shake our heads, and marvel audibly, “Wow, the Bible truly is the Word of God!” Consider an example of this that may be encouraging to testify to your group.
2. Help your group consider some of the points concerning the logic and completion of the Bible in I-II and show how they prove the Bible’s superiority to the Koran or Book of Mormon.
3. Share a testimony of how the Bible changed you inwardly, either convicting, correcting or instructing you in righteousness.
4. Help your group to choose a few verses related to the prophecies concerning Christ in section IV A of the lesson book. Ask them to share when the prophecy was written and how it was fulfilled.
